
Fertility




4 in 5 women made four or more antenatal care visits.





Percent of the household population with at least basic drinking water service




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Children's Nutritional Status


Stunting by District

Percent of children under age 5 who are stunted (chronic undernutrition)





Access to basic drinking water service ranges from 56% in Thaba-Tseka to 91% in Maseru.



More than I in 3 children are stunted.

Stunting is lowest in **Leribe** and highest in **Qacha's Nek**.
