

2013 Nigeria Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS): South South

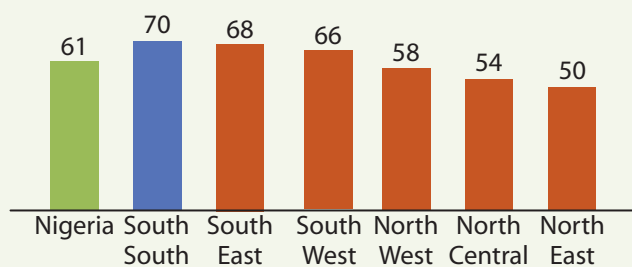
The 2013 Nigeria Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS) provides data for monitoring the population and health situation in Nigeria. The 2013 NDHS is the fifth Demographic and Health Survey conducted in the country.

The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates for urban and rural areas of the country, for each of the six zones, and, in most cases, for each of the 36 states, and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT).

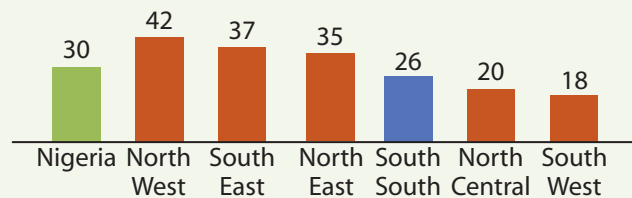
Improved Source of Drinking Water by Zone

Percent of households with an improved source of drinking water



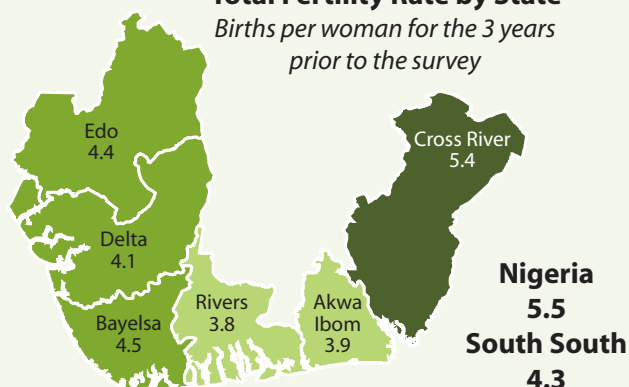
Improved Sanitation by Zone

Percent of households with an improved, not shared sanitation facility



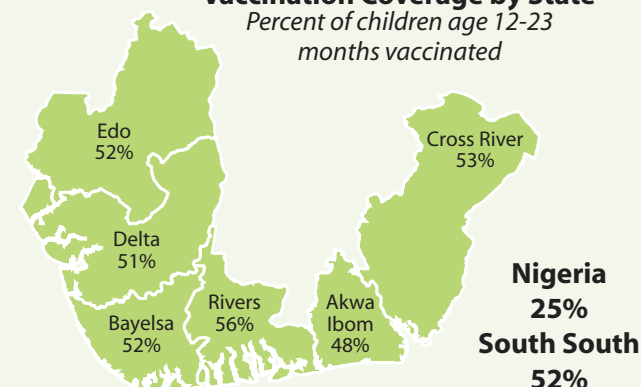
Total Fertility Rate by State

Births per woman for the 3 years prior to the survey



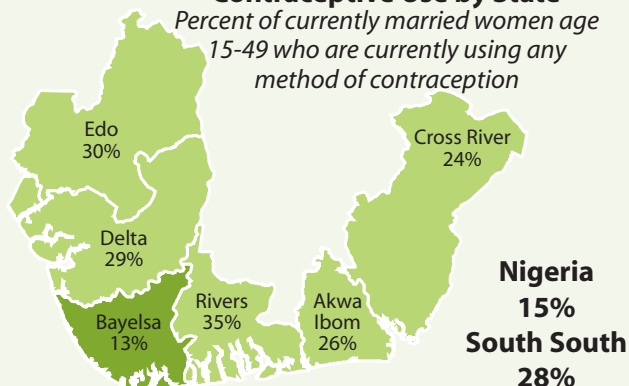
Vaccination Coverage by State

Percent of children age 12-23 months vaccinated



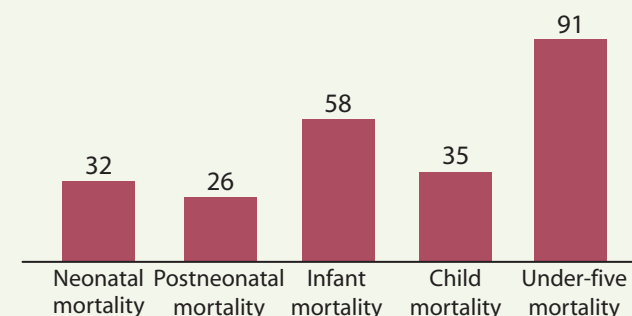
Contraceptive Use by State

Percent of currently married women age 15-49 who are currently using any method of contraception



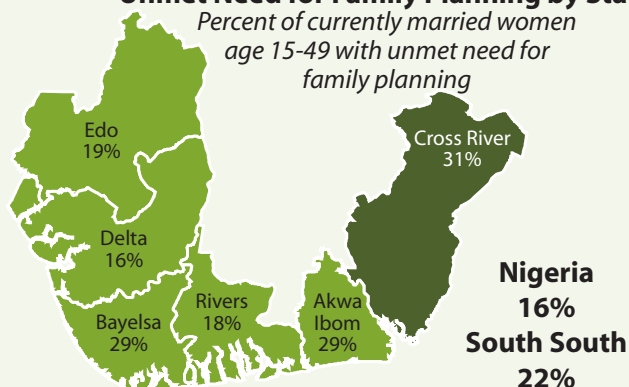
Childhood Mortality in South South Zone

Deaths per 1,000 live births for the 10-year period before the survey



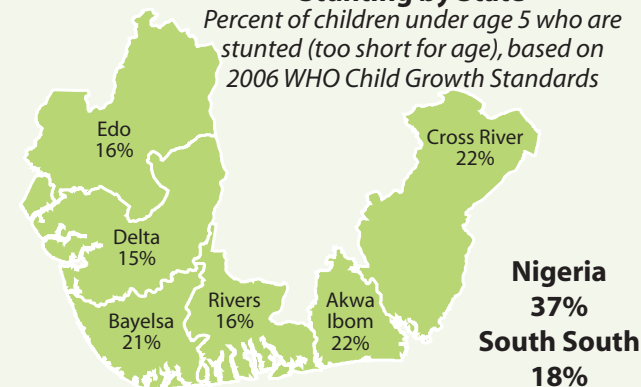
Unmet Need for Family Planning by State

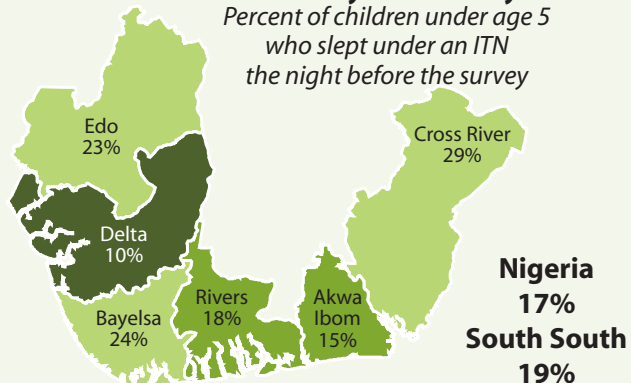

Use of ITNs by Children by State

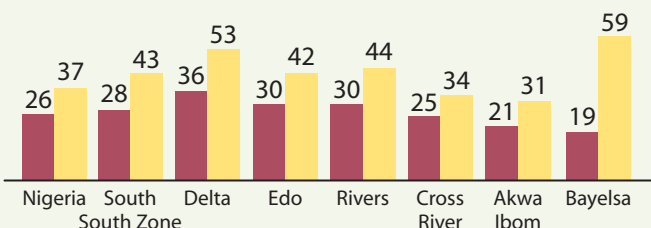
Percent of children under age 5 who slept under an ITN the night before the survey

Percent of women and men age 15-49 with comprehensive knowledge of HIV

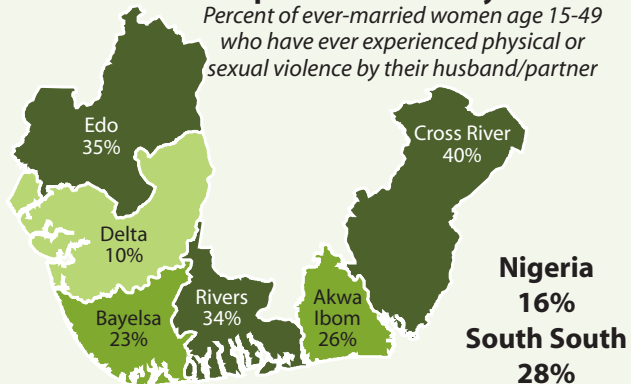
■ Women ■ Men



* Comprehensive knowledge of HIV means knowing that consistent use of condoms during sexual intercourse and having just one uninfected, faithful partner can reduce the chance of getting HIV, knowing that a healthy-looking person can have HIV, and rejecting the two most common local misconceptions about HIV transmission or prevention.
